Back to Back DXI titles was the goal for the 2025 Hilltopper baseball team and that is exactly what they accomplished and more! Coach Kreiger and his club put together a strong close to the regular season winning 5 out of their last 6 games in preparation for the tournament. They made quick work in the semifinals against Weatherly winning 15-0 in 3 innings and then took care of Notre Dame East Stroudsburg by the same score in 4 innings. Next was the PIAA 1A State Tournament where the Hilltoppers garnered the program's first ever state playoff victory over Dock Mennonite by the score of 7-6. In the quarterfinal match up with D2 MMI the team found a way to bring the 3-1-win home advancing to the semifinals against D5 champion Southern Fulton. The Toppers fought hard but came up short, 3-0, and closed out the season one win short of the PIAA 1A State Championship game.

2025 PIAA AA State Runner Up That is how the Green Wave track and field team concluded their season. It was a well-deserved accomplishment for Coach Zimerofsky's squad as throughout the entire season they proved that they were a formidable team that knew no limits. Seniors Noah Dolbin, Michael Stank, Nolan Daynorowicz and Liam Messina dominated their opponents in the 4x400 relay and then added individual efforts to head to Shippensburg qualified for seven track events. Noah Dolbin advanced in all 3 of his individual events and brought back a gold medal in the 110 hurdles and bronze medals in the long jump and 300 hurdles. Then he took the track with his 1600 teammates where they ran a 3:22 and a second-place finish. That added up to 30 team points and a second-place finish in the PIAA State Championship team race.

Congratulations to senior Sara Spolski as she captured victories in the Schuylkill and DXI meets in the 400 meter dash and a return trip to the PIAA state championship. There she ran a personal best :58.88 and closed out her career in 11th place at the meet.

PLEASE NOTE: A policy has become effective for families who receive the Eastern Pennsylvania Scholarship Foundation Scholarship (EPSF). Please read the following carefully:

THE EASTERN PA SCHOLARSHIP ADVISORY BOARD HAS ENDORSED THE FOLLOWING: IF A FAMILY HAS NOT PAID THEIR PAST TUITION BILL (2023-2024) THEY WILL **NOT BE** ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE AN EITC/OSTC SCHOLARSHIP FROM THE EASTERN PENNSYLVANIA SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION.

It is the responsibility of each family to make sure that their tuition is paid in full each year. Failure to do so will make the family ineligible to receive an EPSF Scholarship.
